Healthy Community Planning Best Practices (*Population health and urban form*)

New research concerning ways that transport and land use planning can better incorporate public health objectives, including traffic safety, pollution emission emissions, increased physically fitness and health, community cohesion, and improved access to health facilities. Conventional planning tends to focus on some of these factors, but overlook or undervalue others. Mobility management and smart growth strategies, which reduce per capita driving and encourage use of alternative modes, can provide significant health and safety benefits. When all impacts are considered, mobility management is often a cost effective way to improve public health.
